This is our biggest fundraiser of the year with the monies raised going to scholarships and donations to local organizations.

Throughout the year we have been volunteering at Oakmont Senior Center assisting the residents with flower arranging. Flowers are donated by our local Trader Joe's. If there are left-over flowers, we use them to make "lonely bouquets". Lonely bouquets are left around town with a little note, "The Lonely Bouquet - Please adopt me! We're all alone and looking for a new home. Perhaps we can brighten your day or that of a loved one?". We hope by leaving these around we bring a bit of random cheer to our community.

And speaking of community, we have been helping to maintain many gardens around town. Our crown jewel is the garden at the Northville District Library. Members mulch, weed, plant, trim, and even re-paint the statue when needed. In addition, we work on the garden in front of the Post Office and maintain 2 gardens at the Living and Learning Enrichment Center whose mission is to enhance the lives of participants with disabilities. One is a sun garden; one garden is a shade, so we can house any plants that are donated!

Other activities include volunteering with the Township Beautification Committee; attending regional events, like Daffodil Days, an initiative which celebrates the planting of Daffodils across Detroit; and our monthly meetings where we have varied and knowledgeable speakers on all topics garden and garden related.

XV Bylaws and Proposed Bylaw Motions 2023

Motion1:

On the recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Women's National Farm & Garden Association after review, discussion and evaluation of the Bylaws, it is moved that Article IV, Section 3,B which reads "At least ten (10) people are required, five (5) of whom may also be members of another Branch within the Division," be deleted.

Because the recommendation is made by the Executive Committee, no second is required. Motion Carried

Motion 2:

On the recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Woman's National Farm & Garden Association after review, discussion and evaluation of the Bylaws, it is moved that a Section G be added to Article V which will read "G. Executive Committee Advisor

- 1. Act in an advisory capacity to the Executive Committee.
- 2. Does not participate in any votes of the Executive Committee.
- 3. All past presidents are available for advice."

Because the recommendation is made by the Executive Committee, no second is required. Motion Carried

Motion 3:

On the recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Woman's National Farm & Garden Association after review, discussion, and evaluation of the Bylaws, it is moved Article VI, Section 2, B be amended to read "The election shall be by ballot unless there is only one candidate per office or position in which case the vote may be by voice at either in-person or virtual meetings."

Because the recommendation is made by the Executive Committee, no second is required. Motion Carried

Motion 4:

On the recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Women's National Farm & Garden Association after review, discussion and evaluation of the Bylaws, it is moved that Article VIII, Section A, A be amended to read "The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, the Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary, the Administrative and Operations (A&O) Treasurer, the Educational and Charitable Fund (E&C) Treasurer, and the Immediate Past President who acts as Advisor to the Committee or a designee approved by the Executive Officers if the immediate past president is unable to serve in an advisory capacity."

Because the recommendation is made by the Executive Committee, no second is required. Motion Carried

Motion 5:

On the recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Women's National Farm & Garden Association after review, discussion, and evaluation of the Bylaws, it is moved that Article VIII, Section 5 be amended to read "The Executive Committee may conduct meetings by conference call. The Recording Secretary will take minutes at these meetings and distribute them per Article IV, Section 5, D."

Because the recommendation is made by the Executive Committee, no second is required. Motion Carried

Motion 6:

On the recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Women's National Farm & Garden Association after review, discussion, and evaluation of the Bylaws, it is moved that Article XI, Section 4 amended to read "Proposals concerning expenditure of funds over seventy dollars (\$70), not provided for in the adopted budget, shall require approval of the Executive Committee."

Because the recommendation is made by the Executive Committee, no second is required. Motion Carried
