## BACKGROUND for the Sarah Bradley Tyson Memorial Fellowship

The Sarah Bradley Tyson Memorial Fellowship was established in 1928. Mrs. Russell Tyson served as WNF&GA president from 1921-1924. Mr. Russell Tyson provided financial support to honor his wife Sarah's dedication to women's agricultural studies.

Sarah was devoted to the personal management of her homestead farm, Rice Farm, located in Vermont. Following marriage, she moved to Chicago but continued to regularly return to Rice Farm. She oversaw the farm's orchard, dairy and poultry operations. Young women who were studying agriculture were invited to the farm each summer to receive training in best farm practices. They were also able to earn money to help with their educational pursuits. She supported both rural and urban women. She promoted the importance of agriculture and the connection between city and country living. \*
